2013 IN REVIEW



Bikes and kids are a natural fit. I remember the sense of freedom I had as a kid riding my bike exploring the trails along the creek behind my house and racing home after school with neighborhood friends. Years later as an adult, I travelled the world by bicycle, learning and discovering about the world and myself. The bicycle gave me the freedom to go places and learn new things. I have learned at the very basic level how to use tools, fix a flat tire and adjust my gears. At a life-skill level, I have learned how to communicate and work with others, feel successful at what I do, and treat people fairly and respectfully.

The bicycle is the tool Two Wheel View (TWV) uses to teach these skills to youth. The sense of adventure, experience and passion of the board, staff and volunteers of TWV are what is "changing kids' lives from the seat of a bike" here in Calgary and other communities today.

Building on the achievements of the past year, TWV is moving forward from a position of strength and organizational capital that has been built over the past 14 years. In the past year TWV has made solid progress in our three strategic initiatives: sustainability, growth and results. We have increased program areas to new communities, schools, and youth-serving organizations; increased fulltime staff from two to five; increased marketing, communications and social media initiatives; and diversified our funding streams to include social enterprise and multi-year funding commitments.

In this 2013 annual report you will read a sampling of how TWV uses evidence-based practices to deliver high quality programs serving youth over multiple developmental years. Two Wheel View is a "cycle of success" that begins in local neighborhoods and extends to communities abroad.

I am excited about the course Two Wheel View is charting. I invite you to "Join the Ride"!

Bike Club uses the bicycle as a tool to build self-esteem as well as bike mechanic capabilities in youth ages 11-17. ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Over 150 bicycles earned.
- Operating in 17 Calgary communities.
- Funding provided in part by City of Calgary FCSS to help build self-esteem and valuable skills in young people.
- Participated in the development of Calgary After School's Social– Emotional Learning Training for after-school program providers.
- Developed partnerships with City of Calgary Recreation, Calgary Public Library and the Autism and Aspergers Friendship Society.
- Expanded our program to include two Bike Club programs for home school students during the daytime hours.
- Presented to 100 students on bike safety at Calgary Safety Expo
- Helmets and locks donated by Mosaic Energy and Red Rock Camps.
- Bikes were donated by community members and partners such as the Okotoks RCMP and Bicycles for Humanity- Calgary Chapter.
- Provided support for groups in Florida and Argentina to start their own Bike Club programs based on the TWV model.

FUTURE GOALS In 2014 we will:

- Launch a curriculum-connected program that will teach Grade 4 students about the science of simple machines using bicycles.
- Support 175 youth in earning bicycles.
- Provide support for the development of a Bike Club in another Alberta community.
- Ensure all our programs are filled to capacity.
- Develop a bike camp program to deliver programs over the summer months.



expeditions 2013

TWV offers adventurous and educational travel experiences for youth 14-17 years old, for school and community groups, families and individuals. TWV cycling expeditions involve one to two weeks in Argentina, Norway, Quebec or western Canada. On these trips, participants become attuned to local culture, assume new levels of personal responsibility and gain – literally- the experience of a lifetime!

- Double our Badlands to Banff offering and provide customized 3-5 day trips in the Calgary vicinity.
- Explore a new route in Quebec, adding adventure to our existing Montreal to Quebec City expedition.
- Provide a joint Bike Club/Expedition program for the First Nations Community of Morley.

- Expansion of our staff team to include two part time TWV-Trips Coordinators and one Environmental Education Coordinator.
- Our new program van, which arrived in early 2013, has been an invaluable resource for getting our staff to programs safely and coordinating large bike donation pick-ups.
- Our Board of Directors grew by six members and all nine members have been working hard to develop and deliver upon our strategic plan.
- Our Vehicle for Change Fundraiser introduced more groups and individuals to Two Wheel View and how we are changing kids' lives from the seat of a bike.
